- ◆ Campsite reservation fee \$13.00 tax included.

- ◆ 50 amp sites may be available by reservation. Some non-serviced sites with limited availability.

- ◆ Outdoor Ball Hockey

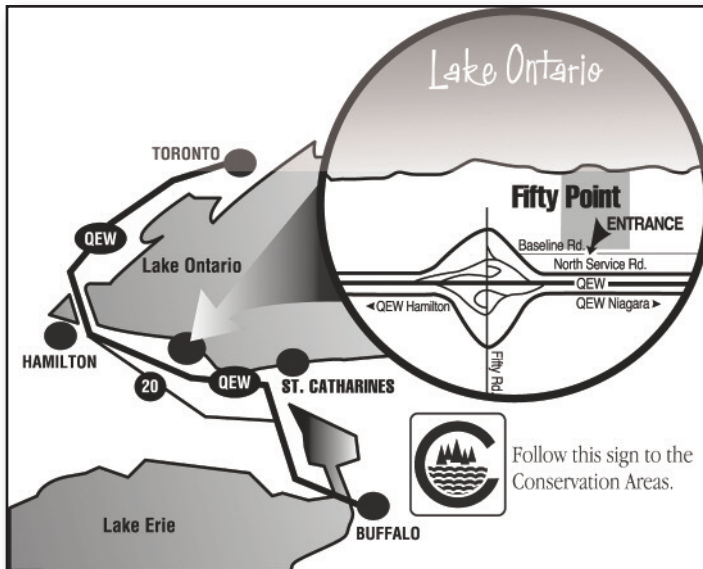
